2021 ACW PROGRAM UPDATES

ACW Fairview and ACW Forestview received naturalized playgrounds designed and installed by Bienenstock Natural Playgrounds. The children, Educators and families are thrilled with the transformation

of the playgrounds! ACW Forestview also underwent an expansion in the centre to include licensed spaces for Infants and Toddlers to compliment the Preschool and School age spaces that were already being offered.

ACW Niagara Community, ACW River View and ACW Connaught were closed permanently. Although it was a very difficult decision the

main reasons included lower enrollment and the lack of qualified Educators to maintain ratios. Families that required spaces were able to be accommodated at other A Child's World locations.

In October all ACW Educators participated in the annual Organizational Meeting via Zoom while enjoying a meal with their centre team. The focus of the meeting was "Gratitude" as our Educators deserve the outmost respect and admiration for their dedication, flexibility and efforts during COVID.

Throughout the Zoom presentation, prizes were randomly drawn from names of those

in attendance. Years of service pins were presented to Educators celebrating their 5,10, 15,20,30 years with ACW; as well awards were presented to Maria Howell for the Barb Sockovie Award of Excellence and to Marie Timothee-Calixte for the Steve Noyes Award.

Congratulations to both of these outstanding ACW Educators!

ACW HEALTH & SAFETY UPDATE

2021 was a tiring year for everyone especially our Educators due to the constant changing of COVID protocols and screening. Through it all, our Educators remained committed to ACW's Mission Statement of Quality Child Care. They worked long hours wearing the required PPE to follow the Health and Safety measures required by the Ontario Government and the Ministry of Education without recognition of their daily hard work. They maintained their focus and continued to work together as a team. The ACW staff portal remained the main mode of keeping communication open and for sending updates of changing COVID-19 protocols, policies, and screenings.

In 2021, ACW participated in the WSIB "Excellence Program". We are currently still working on our 4 topics chosen in 2021 which are Control of Records, Return to Work roles, Return to Work forms, and Accommodations return to work. All evidence of completion must be uploaded to the WSIB Excellence portal by July 31, 2022. It is then reviewed and graded for compliance and then ACW would receive recognition for their participation in the program.

As part of the COVID restrictions and not being able to visit the centres as much, monthly compliance packages and surveys were implemented on the staff portal to ensure that health and safety inspections and assignments were still

being completed.

Centres that required water testing were completed as well as the weekly flushing as per Legislation. ACW held First Aid sessions for our Educators that certifications were expiring while following the COVID protocols at the time.

*The Family Festival and other Fundraising events were cancelled in 2021 due to the COVID 19 Emergency measures and protocols.




FINANCIAL OPERATING RESULTS DECEMBER 31, 2021



SENSORY, AND THE CHOICE TO PICK WHAT THEY MANT TO TRY
































